Please join us for this free information session, co-sponsored by Second Wave and the South Island Community Council (SICC). The session is intended to help youth, between the ages of 15 and 24 years old, and their families transition to adult services.

The Advocate for Service Quality (ASQ), Leanne Dospital, and Scott Guffey from the Office of the Representative for Children and Youth (RCY) will talk about the free services available through their offices.

Leanne is appointed by, and reports to, the Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction. She can help you understand government and community services, and answer questions about what services might be available, how funding decisions are made, eligibility or how to make a complaint if you are unhappy with the support or services you are receiving if you are over the age of 19.

Scott Guffey is an advocate with the Representative for Children and Youth, and can answer questions and provide support to children, youth and families who need help with the child-serving system.
